**The Water of Life Project was formed in September 2003. Its mission: to create a "caring community working together to raise funds to drill wells giving life and hope to African communities." Since then, we have been involved in 39 projects – we have raised sufficient funds to dig 37 wells, repaired many broken pumps and supported health clinics for villages receiving a well. Over 20,000 people now have access to safe drinking water because of our efforts since 2003.**

This year's Water of Life campaign has kicked off and will run until Sunday, April 28<sup>th</sup>!!! We encourage you to support this important, life saving and life changing project and also to inform and encourage your friends, family and co-workers to get involved.
