Random Acts of Kindness Month: February is Random Acts of Kindness Month. Our Pastoral Ministry Committee members are challenging all in our congregation to do Random Acts of Kindness throughout the month – those little things that make our crazy world more livable and bearable. When you do such an act, consider writing it down anonymously and putting it in the Random Acts of Kindness bowl. We’ll share some of what is being done with the congregation during worship each week this month.

Lent begins with **Ash Wednesday**, which this year falls on February 18th. Ash Wednesday is a day to come before God in confession and to receive the forgiveness that God offers. In this way, we begin the season of preparation for Holy Week and Easter, walking with Jesus to the cross and beyond to resurrection. On Ash Wednesday, there will be two services in the sanctuary – a said Holy Eucharist at 11:45 a.m. and a sung Holy Eucharist at 7:00 p.m. At both, ashes will also be offered. If your day is busy and you cannot attend the worship, we will be outside at the clock on Inglis Place at 8:30 a.m. for Ashes to Go which features a shortened form of confession, absolution and anointing with ashes if desired. Plan to begin your Lent with us!

Highlighting: Spiritual Café

Curious about spiritual café? Thinking you may want to attend but don’t have any idea what it’s all about? Spiritual café take place in the church meeting room on specific Fridays from 9:00 a.m. – 12:00 noon (dates are announced in the bulletin). The mission of spiritual café is to be a safe and relaxing place where people can gather to enjoy a coffee/tea or other beverage along with some café style treats while engaging in all manner of conversation on spiritual topics of interest. No topic is off the table.

While we may talk about the bible, or offer prayer at times, spiritual café is not a bible study, an official service, or prayer gathering. People are free to come and go. They can come for a quick coffee or stay the whole time. They can bring their spiritual seeking questions or their favorite spiritual writings or art to share with others.

These gatherings are very informal but may also have specific themes or topics to guide the conversation. Most of all, our spiritual café is a space that offers spiritual nourishment and fellowship. Highlighting: Lectionary Lunch

Curious about Lectionary Lunch? Thinking you may want to attend but don't have any idea what it's all about? Lectionary Lunch is an informal discussion group that focuses each week on the scripture readings for the coming Sunday as we'll hear them in church. We read the passages together and reflect on what we hear them saying to us. It's not a teaching class about the Bible but a group seeking together to find some light in the scriptures we hear. There are no right or wrong answers, just an honest attempt to find relevancy for today in our faith story. Our lives, the news, stories we've heard, and stories we tell are all part of the reflection. Members of the group come as their lives allow and go when their lives get busy. But there is always a faithful core around the parish hall meeting room table. Those who attend say that talking about the scriptures and mulling them over before Sunday helps them to be more present in the worship and to have a greater understanding of the preaching. Rev.
